“The Orion Nebula is one of the brightest star-forming regions in the sky. It is visible to the naked eye and is located about 1,300 light-years away. New stars are still being born inside this giant cloud of gas and dust.”

1,300 light years is approximately 7.64 quadrillion miles. Orion’s belt can be clearly seen with the naked eye.

Analyze this under the inverse square law for light. Also, address the issue of “stars still forming” whereas the “universe” is allegedly billions of years old, so how could stars still be “forming” given alleged gravitational forces, and the alleged universal movement of everything.

However, these stars do not stay in the same position relative to the horizon; they circle the celestial pole nightly due to the Earth's axial rotation, and their orientation changes drastically from season to season. A constellation that is low on the horizon in autumn may be directly overhead in spring.

By claiming that "the stars are the same" despite looking in opposite directions, the meme relies on a premise that contradicts basic, easily verifiable observation. Anyone who tracks the night sky over the course of a year can verify that the summer and winter skies are fundamentally different.

He claims that because the Sun rises due east and sets due west everywhere on Earth during the equinox, this somehow mandates a spherical Earth. When you identify the equinox as the mid-point of the Sun's annual spiral, the entire "mystery" of why it rises east and sets west disappears—it's just the Sun doing exactly what it was designed to do in a stable, orderly, and purposefully created system.
